

NETWORKING BREAKFAST
“LOOKING TOWARDS 2018: SAFETY AND SECURITY”
CONCEPT NOTE
Friday, 2 June, 8.00-9.15 am

Aim

This networking session will focus on possible themes for the 2018 ITF Summit on Safety and Security. The session will gather ITF stakeholders - governments, business, civil society leaders and academia - to discuss and share their ideas and suggestions regarding the most pressing issues they would like to see on the agenda of next year's Summit.

Proposed format

- **This networking breakfast session** will bring together approximately 100 participants seated at tables of 8-10 (in total max 10 tables), each hosted by a discussion leader, for 1h30 hour of exchange.
- **Moderator will welcome participants, introduce** the topic and will also explain how the breakfast debate will work (**2-3 min**).
- **To set the context**, the moderator will introduce a 20-minute panel discussion of 4 speakers (e.g. 2 speakers on safety, 2 on security issues), who will present their perspective regarding key issues on the transport policy agenda related to safety and security (**25 min**).
- The moderator will then invite everyone to **engage in conversations at their table**. Each table will have a specific theme. Table discussions will be animated by the speakers and ITF staff/ stakeholders discussion leaders. (**25 min**)

The speakers/ discussion leaders will “moderate” the discussion at each table, ensuring that all participants at the table have an opportunity to get engaged.

Each table will be asked to prepare one insight/question/perspective to be shared with the other tables.

- The moderator will ask discussion leaders (4-5 short interventions) to **share brief summaries** of their conversations, and then will open the discussion engaging other participants (**15 min**).
- The moderator will **close the debate**; thank speakers, discussion leaders, and participants (**2-3 min**).

Table themes:

The table themes will correspond to six thematic focuses, including:

- 1) Vulnerable road users in cities
- 2) Road safety for an aging population
- 3) Impact of new technologies on safety and security
- 4) Safe system: Towards zero deaths and serious injuries
- 5) Security in supply chains
- 6) Women in public transport.
